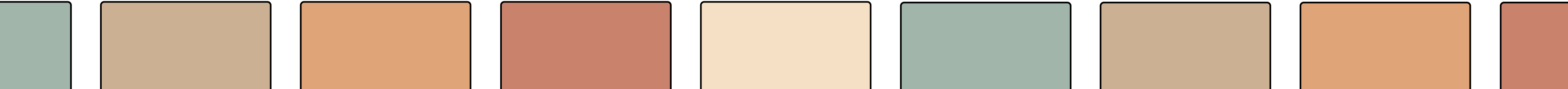
INTL 4371: Israeli Politics
